Rationale

Introduction

Natomas Unified School District (NUSD) is a growing unified school district serving students from ages 3-2 since unification in 1992. NUSD is located in North Sacramento and its student population has tripled from 4,979 students in 1998 to the more than 15,000 students in 2018. Enrollment is projected for continued growth due to extensive home building and expansion of commerce and industry such as the development of the new Centene headquarters in Natomas which will employ up to 5,000 people. NUSD is the 6th largest district in Sacramento County behind Elk Grove, San Juan, Sacramento City, Twin Rivers and Folsom Cordova. The next largest district (Center Unified) is far behind NUSD at 4,332 enrollment. NUSD has been one of nine member districts (plus the Sacramento County Office of Education) of the multi-district Sacramento County SELPA (Sac County SELPA).

Given the ongoing growth of NUSD and the ongoing and worsening funding inequity that has existed since 2001 within the multi-district SELPA, and NUSD's demonstrated ability to locally serve student with disabilities notwithstanding these barriers, NUSD seeks to become a single district SELPA. This would allow NUSD more local control, transparency and accountability, in line with the principles of LCFF and LCAP, as well as the recommendations contained in the Public Policy Institute of California report, *Special Education Finance in California*, and the Statewide Special Education Task Force report. NUSD would receive the special education funding generated by a district and more efficiently use the direct allocation to promote better student programs and outcomes and further the Board of Trustees commitment to local control. It also requires a waiver of the State Board of Education (SBE) Size and Scope standards adopted in 1983 for establishing a single district SELPA.

The NUSD Board of Trustees unanimously approved the Local Plan and SBE/CDE Waiver request on January 18, 2019 after following required procedure and due consideration of stakeholder input.

NUSD California Dashboard - Students with Disabilities (SWD) Subgroup Data

The 2018 California Dashboard data is reflective of NUSDe's ability to meet its obligations to students with disabilities as a single district SELPA. NUSD SWD categories range from green for Graduation Rate to orange for Suspension Rate, and ELA/Math CAASPP scores. While Chronic Absentism and College/Career indicators were not measured for 2017, three (3) categories made improvements for SWD from 2017 to 2018: Graduation Rate grew from orange to green, ELA grew from red to orange, and Math grew from red to orange.



Special Education in NUSD

Approximately 11% of the students NUSD serves have disabilities, and this includes students who attend three charter schools authorized by the District to operate as a school of the district for purposes of compliance with the IDEA. A fourth charter school authorized by NUSD, Westlake Charter School, is a member of the the El Dorado County CHELPA. Although Natomas Charter School is considering LEA membership in two different SELPAs, NUSD is prepared to continue to serve all students with disabilities it currently serves, including those who are attending charter schools authorized to operate as a schools of the district for purposes of compliance with special education requirements.

Despite the inequitable funding allocation by the Sac County SELPA to NUSD, and continued disagreement with the Sac County SELPA over growth funding allocations and the funding allocation formula, NUSD has continued to invest in and improve its special education programs, staffing levels, and professional development with local resources. Currently, the district serves 99.7% of it's students with disabilities within district programs, keeping more of our students with disabilities at their neighborhood schools where they would attend if nondisabled, as the IDEA requires.

Annual Performance Report - State Performance Plan Indicators

The Annual Performance Report (APR) for 2017-18 identifies that NUSD has a “needs assistance” status due to CAASPP Scores, untimely IEPs/Triennials, and discipline disproportionality.

While NUSD’s students with disabilities have not yet met the CDE target for CAASPP achievement, they continue to grow each year in the “Percent Level 3 or 4 Achievement”, and o make notable progress on the California Dashboard:

IEPs and Triennials compliance target is set by the state at 100%. In 2017-18, ten IEPs were late (but ultimately completed), which dropped the NUSD actual target rate to 99.99% and triggered the “needs assistance” status. In order to address the “needs assistance” identified areas, continue to improve the focus on the 17 State Performance Plan Indicators, and become a single-district SELPA, NUSD has expanded its Student Services and Support department by one additional director, two support staff, an Assistant Superintendent over programs, and an Assistant Superintendent over the SELPA (the latter two positions are filled by experienced SELPA Directors). The SELPA wing of the department will oversee compliance and also provide Alternative Dispute Resolution options for parents and families that do not currently exist in the Sacramento County SELPA.

NUSD also recognizes and is working towards not being disproportionate in the area of suspension/expulsion for students who are African-American. Prior to reaching Significant Disproportionality (3rd year in a row), NUSD was working to complete a root cause analysis of the data, attended the Equity Symposium, and to develop a Plan of Action (similar to a CEIS plan). So far this year NUSD has a drop in expulsion and suspensions due to many factors, such as 3 years of PBIS, continued Restorative Justice programs, proactive School Resource Officers, increased focus on attendance with home visits, increased campus safety training, and continued implementation of a Social Emotional Supports program.

NUSD also continues to meet the Least Restrictive Environment targets after increasing Inclusive Practices in 2014/15:

Fiscal Analysis of the Sacramento County SELPA Allocation

The current Sac County SELPA Allocation Plan gives each member district a base allocation that was developed after the change from J-50 funding to AB602 funding. The base allocation can change through additional special education COLA funding. NUSD is currently the lowest per-pupil funded member district at \$247.37 per ADA, despite significant and continued growth in student population and need.

A 2007 Fiscal Crisis & Management Assistance Team (FCMAT) report conducted for the Sacramento County Office of Education noted that NUSD experienced the most growth in the multi-district SELPA since 2001, yet did not receive the commensurate growth funding. The disparate funding exists today.

Since 2001, NUSD has increased in enrollment and commensurate student need, but has not been allocated the corresponding growth in Special Education funding by Sac County SELPA. The 2007 FCMAT study of the Sacramento County Office of Education (SCOE) confirmed this has been an issue since 2001: "Natomas had a 51.16% growth in ADA and a 77.8% increase in UDC. UDC was growing at a rate of 1.5 times the growth in ADA." UDC refers to Unduplicated Pupil Count, a count used to identify students with disabilities at that time and ADA refers to Average Daily Attendance. The report further stated, "However, the growth funding that Natomas received was only 22% of total growth funding, far less than the growth in ADA would have generated." The report further added, "This has left the SELPA out of synchronization with the funding stream which is based solely on ADA," confirming that this funding inequity was known since 2007 and likely before the published FCMAT report.

During the 2016/17 school year, the Sacramento County SELPA facilitated SELPA-level meetings in an effort equalize NUSD. The nearly year-long efforts resulted in only temporary and minimal relief via a 3-year agreement (approved June 13, 2017) to allocate growth funding (if any) to NUSD. Sac County SELPA made one payment of growth funding thereafter in the amount of \$250,000. When the lowest per-pupil funded district is also the fastest growing district, minimal growth payments over a 3-year period will never equalize NUSD.

While the District continuously requested and attempted to achieve equitable funding within its existing SELPA, today the District is the lowest funded per ADA district in the multi-district SELPA (refer to the table below from School Services of California). Its existing SELPA has not proposed or been willing to correct this large funding disparity which impedes the District's efforts to improve program options and opportunities for students with disabilities - in essence, local control.

Impact to the Sacramento County SELPA

The Sacramento County SELPA members have met in order to plan for the fiscal impacts with and without NUSD and Twin Rivers Unified School District. The remaining members have indicated they are prepared to address the fiscal impact. NUSD has not been privy to those meetings and outcomes. As stated above, NUSD has for years made efforts to work within the multi-district SELPA to address the inequitable funding, but to little avail. While not required, in October 2018, NUSD proposed a mitigation agreement to assist with any fiscal impacts due to the district's planned departure from the Sac County SELPA.

Conclusion

NUSD is well-poised to be a single-district SELPA, for the reasons outlined in this rationale. In summary, NUSD is:

- increasing academic achievement and graduation rates for students with disabilities
- educating more students with disabilities in the general education setting and in their neighborhood schools with their peers
- continuing to experience rapid student growth
- not experiencing commensurate growth funding in a multi-district SELPA
- the largest district in a multi-district SELPA with the lowest per pupil funding
- supportive of the recommendations outlined in the recent Public Policy Institute of California and Statewide Special Education Task Force Reports
- committed to local control, including being prepared to be a single-district SELPA

The NUSD Board of Trustees urge the State Board of Education to grant this Size and Scope waiver request and support our district in continued efforts to increase services to our students with disabilities and promote local control.




